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Reading—

We will learn to identify the theme of a poem, read some more poetry, and review figurative language. We will take the test on poetry and drama on Wednesday. We will then begin a unit on reading scientific texts.

Writing—

We will continue sharing our essays on opinion writing. We have also begun an informational writing assignment on famous locations, building, symbols, and people of North Carolina. We will be completing the research online using a graphic organizer, then we will create the final product on Discovery Education's Board Builder tool.

Social Studies—

After the unit on rocks and minerals in science, we will come back to study the American Revolution including important battles in the country and North Carolina's role in the Revolution.

Science—

We will review weathering, erosion, and deposition. We will then begin learning about the types of rocks: sedimentary, metamorphic, and igneous. We will also explore the rock cycle.

Math—

We will begin a unit on decimals. We will learn to decompose numbers by tenths and hundredths. We'll represent mixed numbers with units of ones, tenths, and hundredths in fraction and decimal form. We will also explore the value of decimals using a place value chart.
