

This week in 4th grade:

EOG Review began today. We are reviewing all that we have covered in math and reading. It is a busy time of the year! We are trying to give the students exposure to as many EOG-like questions as possible. We have been practicing these types of questions all year, but we are practicing even more-so now! :) I'm attaching some EOG resources to this newsletter.

Homework—

For homework this week, students have a math and reading packet. They are to do a few math problems each night (I told them how many) and they are to read one reading passage Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday nights. They are no longer required to complete the activities with the passage, only the questions.

Reading—

This week we are reviewing elements found in fictional texts: summarizing, describing characters, author's purpose, point of view, theme, inferencing, and drawing conclusions.

Writing—

This week we are working on writing bio poems.

Math—

We are reviewing place value, estimation, addition & subtraction, and multiplication & division. When we studied multiplication and division earlier in the school year, the students were exposed to a variety of methods. Students need to pick the strategy that works the best for them and practice that way!
