## This week in 4th grade:

**-EOG Testing is THIS Tuesday and Wednesday, May 24 & 25.**  
**-Please have your child to school on testing days by at least 8 am.** We begin testing promptly at 8:30. If your child arrives to school after testing has begun, they will remain in the front office until testing is over; they will then take the EOG at another time. **Testing should be over around 11:30** each day.
